Therefore, the CSPGNO will provide training to its entire staff in the near future as part of its ongoing efforts to eradicate all forms of racism. In addition, the CSPGNO will undertake a thorough review of its policies and administrative procedures with the help of an external firm. The CSPGNO wishes to make it clear that this preventative measure is necessary in a context where our institution is expected to be entirely consistent with its values.

The CSPGNO demonstrates leadership in this area as it continues to make concrete contributions to Greater Sudbury's Welcoming Francophone Community initiative and to invest resources in improving access to direct services that facilitate the integration of newcomers in its school community. The CSPGNO considers integration as a responsibility to be shared by students, parents, partners and staff.

The CSPGNO believes that we must all work together to provide a safe and secure environment where every member of the school community can flourish and achieve their full potential.
